### Saturday, 10 December

The Editorial Marketplace Hours: 11am-8:30pm

[MARKET] 11am: Raised in Australia, Asia-born **Frances Horn** and Asia-based Belgian artist **Heidi Voet** discuss art publishing from their experience working in Asia and elsewhere. Horn, as founder



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and co-founder of Paper View and Index art book fairs respectively, and publishing in Europe and the Americas for over a decade; and Voet, through her installations, collage, and engagement with published media that address transcultural issues.

[MARKET] 12pm: Paper Voices II: Artists' Books and Independent Publishing in Greater China continues the discussion from AAA's Art Basel in Hong Kong 2016 Open Platform programme session. Hong Kong Small Tune Press Artist/Publisher Beatrix Pang and M+ Editor Yuling Zhong reconvene artists, curators, and small publishers to share recent developments around the 'artist book' and its popularity among a younger generation of cultural practitioners in greater China.

[MARKET] 2pm: Taipei-based *Hagai* magazine editor **Lee Yen Yi** converses with artist and *Lovely Daze* founder **Charwei Tsai** about their respective publications. The session also marks the launch of 'Travellers and Musicians', the latest edition of *Lovely Daze*, the bi-annual contemporary art journal Tsai publishes from Taiwan, New York, Paris, and currently Ho Chi Minh.

[MARKET] 3pm: **ruangrupa** + **Friends** discuss the role of art and publishing through collective practice, public engagement, and as a form of social interaction. They also present a selection of their 'RuRu Shop' titles as well as those from cultural colleagues in Indonesia.

[MARKET] 4pm: **Jason Wee** of Grey Projects in Singapore and **Clara Cheung** and **Cheng Yee Man** (**Gum**), artist group members of C&G Artpartment in Hong Kong, discuss region specific circumstances, including the crucial role of self-organised initiatives among the challenges of publishing in the region.

### [AUDITORIUM] 5-7pm: The Editorial Aesthetic

Welcome: **Corinne Diserens**; Introduction: **Ingrid Chu & Kit Hammonds**; Panel: Biennial artist **Kao Jun-Honn**, *e-flux Journal* co-editor **Brian Kuan Wood**, and Sri Lanka non-profit art space and publisher, Raking Leaves founder **Sharmini Pereira** reflect on the potential for independent publishing in Asia amidst a rapidly developing 'industry'. Paying particular attention to the connections, influences, and differences between the making, curating, editing, and writing of art, both in print and online, different perspectives are considered around an 'editorial aesthetics' at the nexus of contemporary art production.

[MARKET] 7–8.30pm: Drinks reception including performances presented in association with Taipei-based art publishers **White Fungus**.

They identify global conventions that have emerged in 'editing' historical readings of artists, curators, writers, and feature cultural practitioners who continue to use art in print, and by extension, libraries and archives, as a site for their work.
